For me, leading KCC is about jobs, skills, apprenticeships, community safety, defending the green belt, working towards a greener economy and delivering great public services.


It also means giving neighbourhoods a voice on local housing, which too often seems a 'David vs Goliath' battle between developers and local people.

They all miss the point. It's not just about **HOW MANY** homes you build. It's **WHERE**.

Some communities welcome the growth and regeneration that comes with new housebuilding, but where a community says 'enough is enough' their voice should be heard.


We believe in spreading housing growth far more widely, and fairly, around the country.

In 2020, KCC successfully fought against a centralised UK housing algorithm that took far too little notice of local opinions. We

campaigned against it and they listened.

MATTHEW SCOTT A REAL VISION FOR REAL POLICING

WHEN MATTHEW
SCOTT walked into Kent
Police's Maidstone HQ as
the newly elected Police
and Crime Commissioner
five years ago, one of his
first tasks was to repair the
damage done by some of
his predecessor's decisions
which had, in the words of the
Chairman of the local Police
Federation, turned Kent Police into
"something of a laughing stock".

Coming from a policing family, Matthew is acutely aware of the challenges that police officers and staff face in the course of their duty and knew they deserved better.

"Anyone with police in the family hears about the assaults and incidents that they have been involved with in their careers," Matthew says. "It's what drives me to make sure Kent Police have everything they need to stay safe and get the job done. PR stunts don't help."

"I also had to re-focus priorities to meet the expectations of taxpayers and ensure that everybody has a voice in the criminal justice system."

Matthew halted the reduction of police and PCSO numbers and set about funding new ones. "You don't stop



crime with PR stunts. You do
it by returning to the basic
principle that honest
residents expect to see
criminals apprehended.
That means recruiting more
police officers and being
clear about what Kent
residents want them to do."

"So far, we've recruited an extra 665 officers and started to see the benefit. Crime is falling, the police are more visible and we are getting anti-social behaviour under control."

Matthew is now advising a number of national policing projects but Kent remains his focus. "I get involved in things that really matter to me like mental health and making sure police budgets are well spent but serving the people of Kent and making sure officers and the victims of crime feel supported is my first priority."

Matthew balances his busy work commitments and family life with his wife and 2 children at their Kent home.

He says, "As a parent, I want Kent to be the safest possible place to be. There are always going to be a few bad people but there's far more good ones about. Police officers need to be respected and set free to do what residents want them to do."

SO DO I.

That's why I have taken full advantage of Boris Johnson's promise to recruit 20,000 more Police and made sure Kent was first in the queue. We've now got 665 extra police officers with another 145 arriving in 2021.

Kent Police now has more officers than at any point in its history.

It's making a huge difference already. We've been able to establish a crime squad that's cut burglary and robbery and expanded the 'County Line' and Gangs Team to drive drugs and weapons off our streets.

I've boosted rural policing, road safety teams and expanded the number of town centre beat officers. You know they work and so do I.

I've cut the average time it takes to answer your 101 calls by 70% and focused PCSO numbers to tackle antisocial behaviour. I also know that for

victims there's no such thing as a low level crime. They all matter.

I've funded the return of the police cadet units across Kent and Medway for those aged 13 to 17, as well as other programmes focused on

young people. Mental health provision has always been a personal priority for me and this pandemic has spurred me on to do even more. Kent needs it.

I am also determined that Kent taxpayers don't pick up the bill for national priorities and have secured millions of pounds of extra support for Brexit preparations, tackling violence, supporting victims and managing traffic to our ports." Matthew
